"Biological Wisdom and Social Transformation" A Collective Exploration



We are living in an exciting time. All over the world germ cells arise and new forms of life are invented. Resistance as a creative and sustainable process of transformation relating to everyday patterns and relationships is being redefined.

This means that the return to elementary and existential practices of everyday life takes a central role. It is a political gesture to grow vegetables on public land, to share seeds, to cook together, to acquire new knowledge in open workshops and produce things collectively. Community work is a political action as well as the question of social transformation as a means to understand the art of living actively and to leave the comfort zone of daily practices and routines.

With the series of actions called, "Biological Wisdom and Social Transformation" we ask to what extent can we invent new social forms when turning to the deep wisdom and intelligence that lies in biological systems?

How for example can expanded knowledge about the life of fungi help to create new metaphors and therby also generate new practices of resistance? How can fermentation processes be applied to social processes? And what social lessons can we learn from bees, ants, algae or bacteria?

With this project, our overall aim is to connect activist and artist groups working on related questions and to create a trans-local exchange of experience, techniques and knowledge based on the idea of sharing "seeds" generated from within the groups. "Seeds" can be anything – a recipe, a poem, a technique, a task etc. – the only provision is that it is not yet a finished product but instead *activates a processes*.

In January, February and March 2015 we will kick off our discussion simultaneously in various cities and towns through film nights and conversation with a focus on the following specific phenomena: **soil, fermentation and fungi.** In order to generate vibrant discussion, during each film night we juxtapose documentary films on the specific topic with related art-based, experimental films and interviews with artists.
